

Writers threaten movement for separate Telangana

Adilabad: Telangana writers have warned the Central Government that there would be Telangana renaissance movement if the demand for separate Telangana was not conceded immediately. Several prominent writers, poets, editors and journalists who attended the 6th annual conference of the Telangana Rachayatala Vedika at Nirmal on Sunday said there would be serious consequences if the patience of the people was tested.

The High Court Judge Justice Narasimha Reddy inaugurated the conference by unfurling the flag and lighting the traditional lamp. A two minutes silence was observed to pay homage to those who laid down their lives for the separate Telangana cause. Ad-

ressing the conference, Justice Narasimha Reddy said that only writers and intellectuals could fight on the side of the people. He called upon them to intensify their struggle against the social evils.

The Resident Editor of The Hans India Tankasala Ashok said in the present circumstances the Central Government was not in favour of a separate Telangana but was afraid to say so as it had to face the ire of the Telangana people.

Telangana Writers Vedika State President Juluruli Gowri Shankar said the people participation in the separate Telangana agitation increased manifold in the second phase of the stir and warned that if early steps were not taken, it might take a turn to become a war against the government.
